# Dear La Côte Church family and friends, With a reflection from Helen Harding:

The other day I was gardening and mulling over the Anglican corner of my twitter feed, which at that time seemed to be full of voices convinced that they were doing worship in the virtual world 'right' and others were doing it 'wrongly'. A lot of the debate seemed to hinge over the Archbishop of Canterbury's kitchen table... There were some interesting points made on all sides, and I am sure that at the right moment the ecclesiology of this time will be fascinating to study. I found myself coming back to this being a time of disorientation... Every conversation I have at the moment seems to have an element of loss, bewilderment, frustration. It feels that this is not the time for discussion and debate, but for waiting and being - letting God be God and following wherever God leads - joining in God's work to ensure the hungry are fed, and justice is done, and doing the rest as best we can, with kindness towards ourselves and those who are doing it differently. We ask for peace with what we are able to do, and grace to assume that others are doing as they are called to do, and thankfulness that God has enough peace and grace to fill in the gaps where we fall short.

Who understands the deep things of my heart

Better than I can ever do, I yield Myself and my perplexities to him And in his house of mercy I am healed
